From the Public Works Department

Two Municipal Bridges are closed: Gobles Road Bridge, and the Silver Bridge on Blenheim Road. These bridges are impassable for vehicles or pedestrians due to major safety concerns. The bridges have been inspected by Engineers. The repairs to Silver Bridge and construction on Gobles Bidge will begin when weather allows.

Construction season is almost upon us. When you see  be aware that you are entering a work zone with people & equipment ahead. Workers are repairing/improving the road to keep it safe for everyone to use. Please slow down, pay attention and be prepared to stop. We want to see that these workers get home safely to their families each and every day. If you see  it means that the road is impassable and you must take an alternate route.

Keep Our Roadways Safe: With spring here, it's important to remind people not to plant crops in municipal right of ways. They obstruct visibility! Public Works staff have the authority to cut down any crops planted on Township road allowances.

The Township Office is able to process your request for a Criminal Record Check/Vulnerable Sector Check. If you require a Vulnerable Sector Check, the OPP requires a letter from the organization stating that you require this check along with a signature. It is required by you to bring two pieces of identification: Driver's License, Passport, Birth Certificate, Hunting License, Blood Donor Card or Student Card. We cannot accept A Health Card as identification.



Have you heard about the **Green Cone Composter** now offered? There are many benefits to the cone. It's made out of recycled materials and allows you to compost kitchen scraps that traditional systems can't break down. Visit us at the Township Office to purchase for \$40!

Wedding season is upon us! Did you know that you can purchase your marriage license at the Township Office? The license must be obtained within 3 months of the marriage date. There is a fee of \$110 to issue the license.

Outdoor Cleaning: With outdoor cleanup starting, cleaning up debris and limiting the level of flammable vegetation surrounding your home is a good practice. Make sure the way you do it is safe – for you, your home, your neighbors. If you are going to have a controlled burn, you **must** call into the Township Office. Failure to call in could mean that you will be faced with the expense of dispatching the fire department out. Controlled burns are not permitted in the villages, Forest Estates or Maple Lake Mobile Home Parks.
